Whale Word Puzzles



Objective

Students practice sounding and spelling new words.

Materials

- Paper and pencils
- Chalkboard or writing surface

Action

- Ask students to name words and terms they have learned while studying whales. Write these
 words on the board. Below are some suggestions.
- 2. Next, write the name "killer whale" vertically on the board. Ask a student to choose a word with the letter "k" in it. Write that word horizontally (so that the letter "k" in "killer whale" is also the k in the word chosen.) Repeat for each letter in the name "killer whale." Below is an example:
- 3. Try again using another whale name.

Deeper Depths

Each student chooses a whale species. Using the letters of he whale's name, the student creates a series of descriptive words about the whale. For example, "baleen," "long," "underwater," and "endangered" describe a blue whale. As students take turns reading their words aloud, the class listens and identifies the first letters of each descriptive word. Then students guess the name of the whale.
